On April 9, 2008 the Broward County Charter Review Commission ("CRC") held its second and final public hearing in accordance with Section 6.02(A) of the Broward County Charter (the "Charter"). At this meeting, the CRC approved ten (10) resolutions proposing a number of changes to the Charter, as well as three (3) non-Charter resolutions to be presented to the County Commission.

## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

**“The CHARTER REVIEW COMMISSION (“CRC” or “Commission”) is charged pursuant to the Broward County Charter, Article VI to conduct a comprehensive study of any and all phases of County Government and propose amendments or revisions to the Charter. These proposed amendments/revisions must be submitted to the Broward County Commission (“County Commission”) no later than the first Tuesday in June of the year in which the term of the Charter Review Commission expires, which is November, 2008. The County Commission must submit the proposed amendments and/or revisions with ballot language on the general election ballot at the next general election.**

**The CRC held its organizational meeting in July of 2006 and chose an Executive Director at this meeting. From July of 2006 to April of 2008, the CRC met monthly, with one exception in November 2008, in order to complete its work. During the months of December of 2006 to March of 2007, the members discussed the topics they believed were most important to Broward County and began collecting data and formulating strategies to determine which topics would be pursued more vigorously. The specific dates of these meetings are set forth on page 6. After a discussion, the CRC members decided that regular CRC meetings would be held on the second Wednesday of each month, from 10:00am to 1:00pm at locations around the County. The CRC formed subcommittees in March 2007. See page 15.**

**The members invited Commissioners and individuals from the departments within Broward County and from the private and public sectors to give presentations and/or provide materials which would ultimately support the recommendations of the CRC. The CRC noticed all regular CRC meetings and all subcommittee meetings as required by the State of Florida Sunshine Law. ## **CHARTER REVIEW COMMISSION FACILITATED WORKSHOP**

**At the onset of this meeting process, The CRC determined that a Facilitated Workshop would be beneficial in understanding the issues that each member raises during the process as well as organizing the process and agendas for future meetings. The CRC engaged an independent consultant to design the process and facilitate the workshop that was held in September 2006.**

The CRC Committee to Establish Subcommittees (“CES”) convened on January 22, 2007. The purpose of this meeting was three-fold: to review the 35 issues raised by the CRC at the facilitated session on September 13, 2006 at Mills Pond Park; to categorize these issues into sub-committees and to bring these recommendations back to the full CRC for their consideration.

The procedure taken by the CES was to establish subcommittees, to place each issue of the 35 issues within a specific subcommittee and, lastly, to vote on whether to retain or reject the subcommittee altogether and to vote on whether to retain or reject an individual issue within a subcommittee.

The subcommittees established by the CES were Administrative Issues/ Governance, Constitutional Officers, Environmental, Health/Social Services, Land Use, Public Safety, Transportation, and Special Districts. After due consideration, the CES eliminated the following subcommittees: Constitutional Officers, Environmental and Special Districts.

The chart on page 10 contains all of the subcommittees including those that were eliminated and categorizes the 35 issues into the pertinent subcommittee. Each issue or subcommittee that was eliminated by the CES is marked by a strike through.

## **OVERVIEW OF SUBCOMMITTEE MEETINGS**

**In March 2007, the CRC members divided into five subcommittees and began in-depth studies of the pressing issues that are impacting Broward County residents and the business community. The subcommittees met approximately every two weeks. The five subcommittees formed by the members were: Administrative Issues/Governance, Health and Social Services, Land Use, Public Safety and Transportation. The Chair of the CRC appointed members to each subcommittee. The list of appointees and issues are set forth on pages 13 and 14, respectively.**

**At these subcommittee meetings, information was gathered from a diverse population and a wide spectrum of individuals, entities and organizations. Individuals were invited to speak on issues for which they were particularly qualified and to submit data. The dates of the subcommittee meetings are set forth on page 15.**

**Each subcommittee analyzed the data and information and voted on the issues they decided warranted placement on the ballot. Legal counsel drafted Resolutions and these Resolutions were brought forward to the regular CRC for its consideration. Public hearings were held as required by Article VI of the Charter to obtain public input on these and other issues. A final vote was taken on each Resolution and these approved proposed Resolutions were presented to the County Commission for filing and placing on the ballot in November, 2008.**

## **FINAL RESOLUTIONS APPROVED BY THE CHARTER REVIEW COMMISSION**

**On April 9, 2008 the Broward County Charter Review Commission held its final public hearing in accordance with Section 6.02(A) of the Broward County Charter (the "Charter"). At this meeting, the CRC approved ten (10) resolutions proposing a number of changes to the Charter, as well as three (3) non-Charter resolutions. They were presented to the County Commission on May 13, 2008. They will be placed on the ballot for consideration by the electors of Broward County at the General Election to be held on November 4, 2008 in accordance with section 6.02 (C) of the Charter. The Resolutions are set forth below.**

### **1) Resolution 2008-001 (Metropolitan Transit Authority)**

#### Amending Charter Section 3.08

Providing for the Creation of a Metropolitan Transit Authority (MTA). Providing for the Creation of a Board of Trustees for the MTA. Providing for Membership, Appointments, Terms of Office, Powers, and Duties. Providing for the Funding of the MTA. Amending the Definition Section of the Charter to Provide for a Transit Authority. Amending Section 3.08, "Department of Transportation" to Provide for the reference to the Office/Department of Transportation.

### **2) Resolution 2008-002 (Non-Interference in County Administration)**

#### Amending Charter Section 2.07

Providing for a Prohibition of Interference by the County Commission in Matters Relating to County Administration.

### **3) Resolution 2008-003 (County Commission Meetings Rules and Voting)**

#### Amending Charter Section 2.05

Requiring County Commissioners who recuse themselves from voting on a specific matter being considered by the County Commission Pursuant to Chapter 112, Florida Statutes, to leave the Commission Chamber and not communicate or participate in the discussion related to that matter at the time of the vote.

Allowing County Commissioners who recuse themselves from voting on a specific matter being considered by the County Commission Pursuant to Chapter 286, Florida Statutes, due to the appearance of a voting conflict, to disclose the conflict prior to the debate, to remain on the dais and participate in the debate related to that matter at the time of the vote.

### **4) Resolution 2008-005 (Broward County Housing Council)**

#### Creating Charter Section 11.07

Providing for membership criteria; providing for terms; providing for vacancies; providing for bi-monthly meetings; providing for duties and responsibilities.

**5) Resolution 2008-006 (Broward County Regionalism Policy Statement)**

Creating Charter Section 1.06

Providing for the inclusion of a statement detailing the Broward County Government's duty to develop Programs, Policy, and Budget with a Countywide and Regional Focus.

**6) Resolution 2008-007 (Broward County Park Preservation)**

Creating Charter Section 8.13

Providing for Designation of all County owned Parks located in Broward County as either Natural Area Parks or Regional Parks, Providing for a Requirement that certain land acquired by Broward County shall be designated as either a Natural Area Park or a Regional Park; Providing for the requirement of a referendum to change the use or to sell the county-owned parks designated as Natural Area Parks; Providing for the requirement of a referendum to change the use or to sell the county-owned parks designated as Regional Parks, Providing for the preservation of parks transferred from Broward County to Municipalities or other entities.

**7) Resolution 2008-008 (Environmental Policy Statement)**

Creating Charter Section 1.04 (P)

Providing for the inclusion of a statement detailing the Broward County Government's duty to enact policies which protect citizen's right to a sustainable environment while encouraging the stewardship or natural resources.

**8) Resolution 2008-010 (Broward County Ethics Commission)**

Creating Charter Section 11.08

Amending the Charter to create a Broward County Ethics Commission for the specific purpose of preparing a Code of Ethics for consideration by the County Commission and/or the electors of Broward County.

**9) Resolution 2008-014 (Redistricting Process)**

Amending Charter Section 2.01

and Creating Sections 2.16 and 2.17

Providing for the use of an independent redistricting consultant to develop plans for redistricting of the County Commission single-member districts, and to develop plans and implement appropriate standards for the redistricting of the County Commission single-member districts.

**10) Resolution 2008-016 (Support for Children’s Services) – Non-Charter Item**

Recommendation requesting the Broward County Board of County Commissioners to Continue Supporting Children’s Services as a Priority in Broward County.

**11) Resolution 2008-018 Management and Efficiency Study Committee (MESC) Final Report – Non- Charter Item**

Recommendation to request the Board of County Commissioners to provide a responsive report to the MESC no later than 6 months after receipt of the MESC report.

**12) Resolution 2008-019 (MESC Meeting Schedule)**

Amending Charter Section 10.01

Providing for the Management and Efficiency Study Committee to convene in 2009 and every six (6) years thereafter.

**13) Resolution 2008-020 (Annexation of Unincorporated Area) – Non-Charter Item**
